Senior Gaelic Football – Our senior team began the season last September with the Flanagan Cup down in Knockmore GAA Grounds. We played Scoil Mhuire & Padraig Swinford, Davitt College and Gortnor Abbey. We were victorious against Swinford but it wasn't enough to qualify for the final. For our Connacht campaign, we were in a group with Abbey Community College Boyle, Dunmore Community College, Roscommon CC and Elphin. Unfortunately, the break of the ball didn't go our way and we failed to qualify for the knock-out stages.

Junior Gaelic Football – Our Junior team started the campaign with the Colleran Cup in Bekan. After victories over Swinford and Davitt College they qualified for the final of the competition where we are to play Our Lady's Secondary School, Belmullet (venue and date TBA). For the Connacht league, we were in a group with Foxford, Balla, St. Brendan's Belmullet and Gortnor Abbey Crosmolina. It was a good learning curve for our Junior players to play schools with a larger pool of players to choose from and this experience will stand to them in the future.

Juvenile Gaelic Football – Our Juvenile team participated in 2 blitzes which were specifically designed for schools with a small playing population. The first blitz took them to Castlebar where they played Louisburgh and Swinford. The second day was in Bekan where the opposition was Castlerea and Swinford. Again, our players played with great effort and enthusiasm but didn't reach the knockout stages.
